






Pay Stations accepting both credit cards and Empire Passes


Stewardship & Resiliency: Creating an Energy Neutral Park System

- Five State Parks will be energy neutral by 2019. By 2030, our goal is that 50 percent of our system will be energy neutral
- Robert Moses is the 1st energy neutral state park of its size in the nation. Solar installations have been completed in 29 state parks
- Clean lighting and Photovoltaic Solar Arrays save State Parks nearly \$1 million annually in energy costs









Economic Benefits of the NYS Park System

Findings of the 2016 Economic Impact
Study by Parks & Trails, New York

- Supports 54,000 privatesector jobs annually
- Totals \$5 billion in total output and sales annually
- Nets nearly \$2.9 billion in additional state GDP annually

Every \$1 invested in parks supports \$9 in sales statewide





